Poetry Writing and Appreciation

To be tutored by the well known poet, **Marilyn Arnold**, will be held fortnightly on **Thursday afternoons at Tresca.**

Marilyn Arnold, is a Tasmanian writer and poet who has published four books of poetry, and has been writing for over forty years. As the inaugural president of the Tasmanian Branch of the Society of Women Writers, she has long been associated with the Fellowship of Australian Writers, Tasmania, and runs the monthly open mic poetry readings in Launceston, "Poetry Pedlars," which now meets at the Sports Garden Hotel; the longest running poetry open mic in Australia.



Marilyn has **recently published two books of poetry**: "**Capture**" with Carol Easton, and "**Lies, Lovers and Other Constructions** - 80 poems by Marilyn Arnold".

The back of this latter book states:

"These are poems about the everyday: about childhood, relationships, motherhood, siblings, lovers (and their many lies), family, travel, dementia, the spiritual journey, place, conversations stolen from others. They are semi-autobiographical, but like any life under construction, there are always lies."

HISTORY With Raimund Bruns PHILOSOPHY



OUR VENUES

This beautiful property at **Exeter,** known as the **Tresca Community Centre,** is where numbers of the TVU3A classes are held. Tresca, built between 1909 and 1911 by Mrs Francis Reid and her son Eric was one of the first and largest homes to be built in the West Tamar. In 1958 it was a home for child migrants, most of whom arrived under the parent following scheme.



U3A Online is an individual, independent and autonomous University of the Third Age. U3A Online offers useful resources for older people, especially those who are geographically, physically or socially isolated. Membership is \$35 per year from the date of joining and membership includes access to all independent study courses.

The annual **membership for TVU3A for 2025** is set at \$20 p.a. but **enrolments made after 30 June will be a very reasonable \$10.**
